PRIORITY 1.1 Raising awareness among the public, and in the educational system in general, about the structural roots, causes and consequences of male violence against women and working to break up the stereotypes that underpin the violence

- to carry out awareness-raising projects – within the framework of civic education programmes – in schools at all levels, on the topics of gender stereotypes, discrimination and offences against women's integrity and dignity, and non-violent conflict management, and to provide information and training on how to recognise violence and abuse;
- to promote innovative training courses and teaching methodologies, including students' voice-based approaches, addressing students, as part of the implementation of the guidelines for teaching civic education, and nationwide training courses aimed at teaching staff in schools at all levels, also working with research bodies and institutions (e.g. universities, Indire), organisations and national networks with proven experience in education on respect for diversity, the culture of non-violence and combating stereotypes;
- to disseminate good practices in schools, through peer tutoring and peer education, for example, as well as testimonials from young people who have effectively and positively dealt with complex relational situations;
- to organise working/discussion groups among students, with the involvement of teachers and the possible support of scientific or professional bodies, dedicated to discussion and reflection on the issues covered by the Protocol.

Promoting and implementing the Guidelines, issued in accordance with Ministerial Decree No. 183 of 07-09-2024, as required by Law 92/2019 on Civic Education, which set out “specific targets for the development of specific skills sets and learning goals” for schools.

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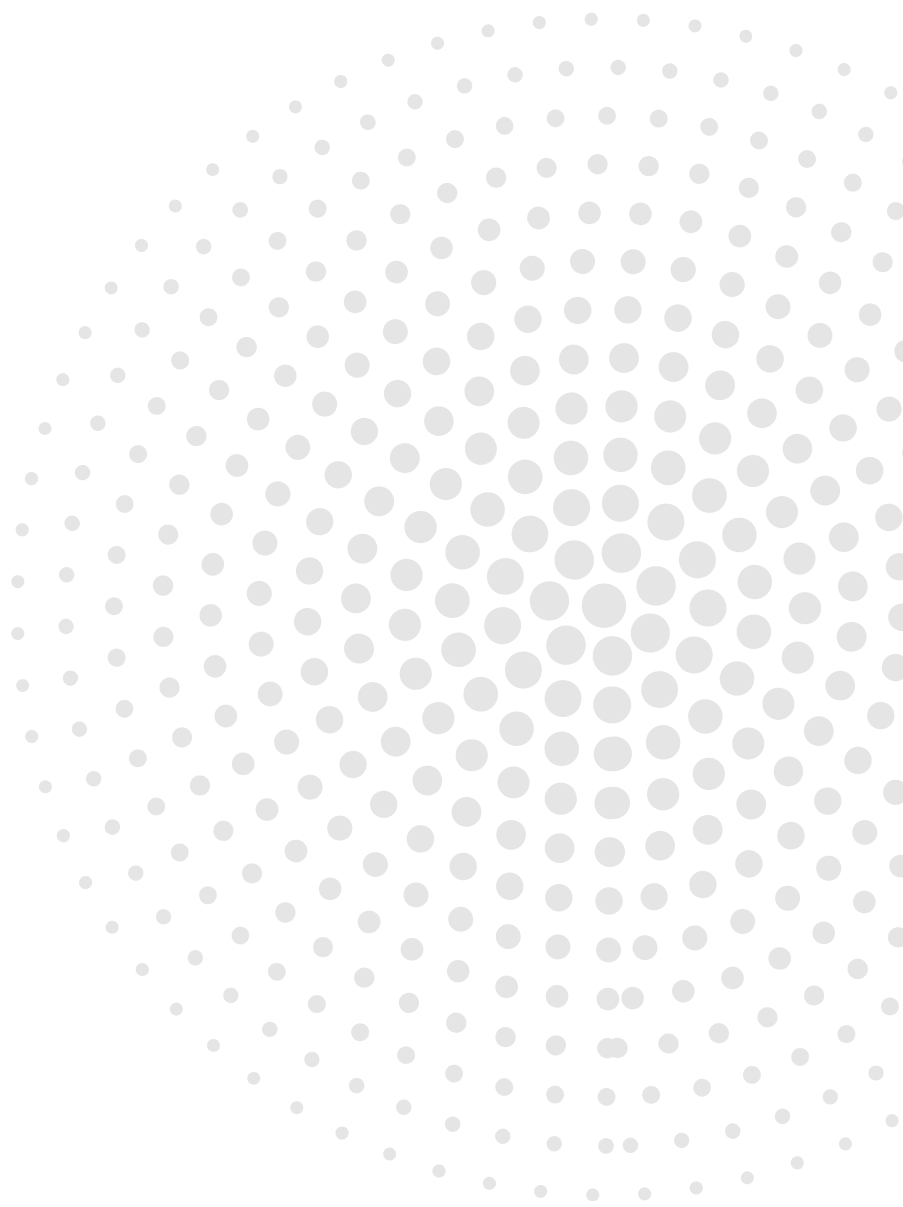
